Could you please advise me as to how many clients who have been provided a service or are still receiving a service by Wye Valley NHS trust have a diagnosis of dementia during the the year of 2019 . Does the trust record such information on clients medical notes. Thank you.

The Trust has bespoke Dementia services (Admiral Nursing) which were set up in July 2019. They had 296 appointments in that time for the rest of 2019.

Records of Dementia are made in patient notes. For example if a Patient comes in for a hip replacement, the Dementia will be recorded as a secondary diagnosis.
