Wye Valley NHS Trust responds:

As a general response, the Trust shares necessary information with local STP partners and agencies as appropriate but do not at present have a formal information-sharing network in place.

The Trust does not have a formal data literacy programme either, training is done on an ad-hoc basis as needed.

For the following questions, I understand data analytics technology to mean software that aggregates and analyses data to identify patterns and deliver insights.

- Is your hospital part of a multi-agency integrated network that shares data for analysis? If so, please confirm with which agencies you share data (i.e. police, social services, fire services, etc.)
- Is your hospital part of any of the following networks and, if so, do you share data for analysis with other organisations in this network:
 - Integrated Care Partnership
 - Integrated Care System
 - Primary care groups, e.g. GPs
 - Local Integrated Care Record Exemplars
- If your hospital is part of a multi-agency integrated network that shares data for analysis, does the network conduct analysis for the following use cases:
 - To understand key population health issues
 - To allocate funding for key preventative work
 - To identify vulnerable and high-risk people for support interventions
